Message From The Manager

On Friday, September 19, 2014, a meeting was held between school administration staff, members of the Laurinburg Downtown Revitalization Corporation (LDRC) and City staff. The vision of improving the area beside the A.B. Gibson Center, including the abandoned service station, was shared and discussed.

That meeting sparked a key partnership between the schools, county, city and the LDRC and plans to clean up this area quickly went underway. Through this collaboration, costs were shared, landfill tipping fees were waived, and City staff preformed in-kind services. The end result of this vision of sprucing up the "gateway" to Historic Downtown Laurinburg is now our beautiful Art Garden.

The design and layout of the Art Garden was created with help and guidance from UNCP's art professor, Adam Walls. We have teamed up with his department at UNCP to offer an area to display his student's sculptures.

Their large, creative pieces will be replaced with new art each year. There will also be a wheat-paste mural on the A.B. Gibson exterior wall to serve as a backdrop for the garden and is part of the Echode project by Laurinburg native, McNair Evans.

I look forward to continuing a collaborative effort between our local organizations for future successful projects. We can provide a stronger and more efficient effort to see visions and ideas to fruition when we all partner together.

Recycling Schedule

CITY OF LAURINBURG

Bi-Weekly Recycling Schedule

2016 - 2017



The City of Laurinburg collects residential curbside recyclable materials on a bi-weekly collection schedule. Each residence is assigned to either the **GREEN** or **RED** recycling route. This determines which week recyclables are collected according to the schedule below.

The recyclables will still be collected on the same day of the week as garbage. For example, if garbage collection day is on Monday, then recyclables collection will be every other Monday.

The City of Laurinburg now collects all the following items in the curbside recycling program:

Newspaper; Aluminum Cans; Steel Cans; All plastic containers with #1 - #7 on bottom (does not include Styrofoam); Magazines; Mixed office and computer paper; Cardboard; Clear, Brown, and Green glass bottles; Used Motor Oil (secured in a plastic bottle with a tight cap and placed beside the recycling cart); Used Cooking Oil (secured in a plastic bottle with a tight cap and placed beside the recycling cart)

Other Solid Waste Collection Schedules:

Corrugated cardboard is collected every other week along with other recyclables. Please flatten your cardboard boxes and place inside or next to your recycling cart on your scheduled recycling collection day.

Yard Waste is collected as often as possible with a goal of one pickup per week. It is not assigned to any particular day as the trucks just get as far as they can each day. Please separate all yard waste into two separate piles, one containing limbs, shrubbery clippings, and/or pine cones, and the other containing leaves and/or grass clippings. The City does not pick up any limbs, logs, stumps, or mulch from tree removal.

Bulky Items are collected weekly on the same day of the week as household garbage. Please place your bulky items at the curb on the same day that you place your roll-out cart at the curb for collection. Bulky items includes all large trash items that can't fit in your cart, such as furniture, white goods (appliances), television sets, large toys such as bicycles and swing sets, lawn equipment, and used tires. The City does not collect building materials resulting from construction, demolition, remodeling, or repair work.

Bulky items may not be placed at the street more than 24 hours prior to your scheduled collection day.
